He was born in 1982. He studied ethnomusicology at the Belgrade University School of Music and Communicology at the Faculty of Media and Communications in Belgrade. He is active as an instrumental soloist, composer, music arranger and producer. He has been involved in studio recording since 1999 and has cooperated with a number of famous musicians in the region like Vlado Georgiev, Severina, Željko Joksimović, Sergej Ćetković, Saša Kovačević, Jelena Tomašević, Goca Tržan, Željko Vasić, Lexington Band, Bojan Marović, Dženan Lončarević, Ana Stanić, Neda Ukraden, Zana.

For seven years he has continually worked on music projects dedicated to autistic children that resulted in the inclusive musical called "Around the World in Eighty Days". Musica was produced in cooperation with the Republic Autism Support Association and Ksenija Mirković and it was published by the PGP Record Label. It was the first recorded performance in the world of the children with autism who sang a "Fairy's Song".

He composed music for several documentaries and feature films.

He has won several Grand Prix awards for compositions at pop and children's music festivals. He also won twice at the "Magic" Children's Music Festival, and he got the first prize at the International Children's Festival in Banjaluka and the Feras -Radio S Festival.

He participated int the 2011 Eurovision Song Contest as the instrumental and backing vocalist, with the composition "Nije ljubav stvar" (Love Is not a Thing) performed by Željko Joksimović.

He also arranged the song "Svet u mojim očima" (World in My Eyes) performed by Emilija Đonin representing Serbia at the Junior Eurovision Song Contest 2014.
